Editorial

This issue of the Journal carries six articles, on different topics.

In the lead article, the SAI researchers analyse the difference between the predicted medal tally and the actual performances of the weightlifters at the 2014 Commonwealth Games and found that about 92 percent of the prediction was achieved. On comparison of performances of the weightlifters at 2010 and 2014 Commonwealth Games, they found that in some categories weights lifted by the weightlifters of CWG 2014 were lower than the medalist of CWG-2010!

The second article studies the height-weight-ratio of men and women medalists of 2014 Commonwealth Games, of the disciplines of Boxing, Table Tennis, and Weightlifting. Since height-weight-ratio is a measure of body composition and body fat, this information would help the Indian sportspersons, of these disciplines, to monitor their body composition and to improve their performance.

The third article is a case study of the increditable performance of the gymnast, Ms Oksana Chusovition, who participated consecutively in six Olympics, from 1992 to 2012, and achieved incredible performance, at the age of 39 years, by winning a silver medal, on vault, at the Asian Games 2014! This article is a compliment to this great gymnast, super-sportswomen and a great

mother, who is a source of inspiration for the young gymnasts.

In the fourth article, studying neuroticism among Cricket players, the researchers conclude that it does not depend on level of participation or their specialization such as batsman, bowlers or wicket-keeper etc.; and that international players show the lesser neurotic tendency as compared to school / college / club level cricket players.

The fifth article finds that the female Physical Education students are superior in Physical Education aptitude to male Physical Education students.

The last review article highlights the importance of sports science and discusses the ways in which sports science disciplines of Sports Psychology, Kinanthropmetry and Training Methods help shape better athletes.

Hope you would enjoy going through these research studies and find these helpful.
